	<b>Location:</b>	The railway section (about 946 km) is the proposed new line between Mtwara Port and the mineral fields of Mchuchuma and Liganga, south west of Tanzania.
	<b>Short Description:</b>	The railway line will provide connectivity from Mtwara Port to Liganga Iron Ore fields located about 874km west of Mtwara Port. The studies made an estimation reserve size of between 200 – 2000 million tones at Liganga.

		And also provide connectivity from Mtwara Port to Mchuchuma coal fields located 946km from Mtwara around Lake Nyasa in the South-western part of the country. Mineral reserves in Mchuchuma coal fields are estimated 159 million tones as proven and 377 million tones as inferred. The proposed railway line will be constructed at Standard Gauge, with 120 pounds rails and concrete sleepers.
